ca

sound in:

- calamares
- crema catalana
- un chocolate caliente

co

sound in:

- un chocolate caliente
- una coca cola

accents

Accents indicate the vowel is stressed. As seen in the words jamón, limón and café.

stress placement

Words that end in a vowel, 'n' or 's' are normally stressed on the second to last syllable Like in cho-co-la-te.

un

Singular indefinite articles/determiners 'a/an'

unos

unas

Plural indefinite articles/determiners 'some'
