We are learning....

- That we are lucky to live in a diverse society created from people of many ethnicities, faiths, cultures and backgrounds. It is important to show respect to others, whether they are similar to or different from ourselves.
- Our communities are made up of people who share some similarities. These may be where they live, where they work, or something they share.
- That British laws are the rules by which society works. People keep the rules to help our communities and people within them stay happy and safe.
- That our local governments look after our communities by providing in areas such as education, transport, waste collection, recycling facilities and community centres. Within this, they help to ensure everyone has equal opportunities and access to everything they need and that people's human rights are met and protected.



- The national government is made up of the cabinet and the prime minister. They are elected to make important decisions about how the country works and enable us to live happy and successful lives.

Key Vocabulary

community	A group of people who live or work together in the same place, or have a shared interest or experience.
ethnicity	Shared culture, customs, language or beliefs.
faith	A strong belief in something. To follow a religion.
identity	Special things about us that contribute to who we are. This could include our name, family, culture, interests, hobbies and the way we choose to express ourselves.
democracy	The belief that there is freedom and equality between all people and they should have a say in the way they are governed.
diverse society	A society which is made up of many different types of people.
responsibility	Tasks that we do to contribute or things we are in charge of.
prejudice	Having an opinion without reason or experience to justify it.
discrimination	Unfair treatment of a person or group based on who they are, where they are from or how they choose to live their life.
stereotyping	Assuming someone will behave in a certain way because of a certain characteristic. This could be based on the way they look, the way they speak, where they come from or their gender.
local government	The organisation of politicians who are in charge of running the town or city. These politicians are voted for and elected.
national government	The group of politicians who make decisions about how the country should be run. These politicians are voted for and elected.
charity	An organisation which provides help and raises money for those in need.
voluntary organisation	An organisation formed of a group of people who volunteer to help a cause without being paid.
