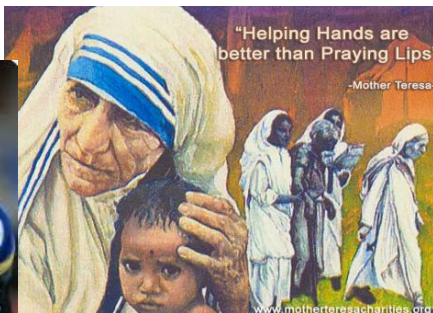

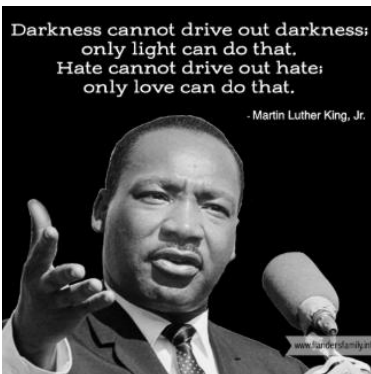
- To consider varied answers to what makes a person inspiring.

Key Vocabulary

leader	The person who leads or commands a group, organisation, or country.
inspirational	Providing or showing creative or spiritual inspiration.
prophet	Speaks on behalf of a God
holiness	To live life in a way that reflects God's glory; total devotion to God.
spiritual	Relating to the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things.
vision	An encounter with God where he imparts future events or situations.
values	Principles or standards of behaviour; one's judgement of what is important in life.
Role model	A person looked to by others as an example to be imitated.
